Motorways of the Sea – general objective – Article 21 of Regulation 1315/2013

• Are considered the <u>maritime pillar</u> of the Trans-European Transport Network [...] contributing towards the achievement of a <u>European Maritime Transport</u> <u>Space without barriers</u> for Short Sea Shipping, connecting the Core Network Corridors by <u>integrating</u> <u>the maritime leg</u> and also facilitating maritime freight transport with <u>neighbouring countries</u> [...] They shall also promote <u>sustainable shipping concepts</u>.





MoS Detailed Implementation Plan development priorities

- I. Environment
- II. Integration of maritime transport in the global logistics chain
- III. Safety, Traffic Management and Human Element





MoS specific objectives

- Deploying an <u>alternative clean fuels</u> infrastructure and developing <u>environmentally sustainable shipping</u> (DIP Pillar I)
- Improving <u>maritime transport integration</u> in the doorto-door logistics chain (DIP Pillar II)
- Upgrading or establishing new <u>maritime links</u>, including combined investments in ports (DIP Pillar II)
- Promoting <u>wider benefits</u> such as Maritime Safety, Traffic Management, Human Element/Training (DIP Pillar III)



MoS Detailed Implementation Plan – next steps

- Ongoing consultations with Member States and industry stakeholders.
- Aim: to present a more specific/focused proposal together with available data on ports.
- Adequate budget!!!
